we were waiting the Police arrival.

- A Just my ten year old daughter and myself.
- Q Did he make any statements to you of any sort?

A Well, when he first arrived, I had asked him what he had needed or if he needed help, in which he stated he needed an ambulance. I therefore informed him that our fire company does not have an ambulance but, "I can get one for you in a short time." I then left him in the fire hall, and at that time I asked him what the address was, and he told me 2254 Pine Road. At this time, I informed him that ambulance and the A.L.S. unit are practically on the scene, and that's when he informed me that the child was beaten.

- Q Tell me, what was he like when he was talking with you?
 - A It seemed like he was in a state of disbelief.
 - Q What do you mean?
 - A In other words, walking around in a daze.
- Q Do you recall the exact statement that he made at that time?

A I had asked him if he knew who assaulted the child or beat the child, and he put his head down and said, "Yes, and I know who did it." He muttered something like,

"I think I killed her." 1 I have no further questions. 2 CROSS-EXAMINATION 3 BY MR. NESS: 4 Mr. Little --Q 5 A Yes. 6 -- it was Mr. Hake then who took the initiative 7 apparently to summon an ambulance? 8 Well, in earlier testimony, he did go for an 9 ambulance, in which this is the time I saw him at our fire 10 hall. 11 Q His first statement to you was simply that the 12 child was beaten? 13 Á Yes. 14 And he couldn't believe it -- disbelief. Q 15 It just seemed like he was in a daze, like, you 16 know, "What's happening?" I had asked him to move the car 17 that he had off the ramp of the fire company, and at that 18 time I figured, well, if he's going to run for it, he's 19 going to go now. He went out and moved the car around to 20 the side --21 And he didn't try to take off? Q 22 He didn't try to take off at all. Seemed very, 23 at the moment, submissive. 24
